To exhibit your images for the display, none must be larger than 7" x 5" (175x125mm). They may be monochrome or colour. Please make sure you put your name on the back of your entries. Each photo will be given a number, and a vote to find the favourite image will take place. Photos must be displayed by 6.45pm and voting will end at 8.15pm. The favourite images of the evening will be announced soon after the close of voting

RULES OF THE SHOW

- 1. There is no entry fee. Show cards will be provided and must be filled in for each entry.
- 2. Exhibits may be staged from 5.30 to 6.45pm. Judging will start at 7.00pm.
- 3. Any exhibits not completed by 6.45pm will not be accepted.
- 4. There is no limit to the number of entries by an exhibitor in any class but no exhibitor may take more than two awards in any one class.
- 5. Entries will be judged to "Village Show" standards.
- 6. All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor and have been in his/her possession for *at least three months*.
- 7. Exhibitors must provide their own containers and support material, eg moss. Up to three leaves of the appropriate foliage may be included for classes 1 to 10, otherwise not restricted.
- **8**. Prize certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places as appropriate and will be displayed on the exhibit but no prizes will be awarded.
- 9. Definitions: Primrose flowers originate from the base of the plant Polyanthus - clusters of flowers on a single stem
- **10**. In any dispute concerning the Rules of the Show or Definitions the decision of the Show Secretary shall be final.

11. The judges will select their "Best in Show "exhibit and a certificate will be awarded
