<u>Trumpet daffodils</u> Cup as long or longer than a petal

Class 1a One stem Class 1b Three stems

Large cupped narcissi Cup more than 1/3rd length of a petal

One flower to a stem
Class 2a One stem
Class 2b Three stems

Small cupped narcissi Cup no more than 1/3rd length of a petal

One flower to a stem
Class 3a One stem
Class 3b Three stems

Double narcissi All types

One flower to a stem
Class 4a One stem
Class 4b Three stems

Multi-flowered narcissi More than one flower to a stem

Class 5a One stem
Class 5b Three stems

Miniature narcissi Flower less than two inches diameter

Class 6a Single flower, three stems
Class 6b Multi-flower, three stems

Pheasant eye narcissi Scented

Class 7a One stem
Class 7b Three stems

Tulips "Conventional"

Class 8a One stem
Class 8b Three stems

Tulips Miniature varieties

Class 9a One stem Class 9b Three stems

<u>Tulips</u> Any other variety (ie not classes 8 and 9)

Class 10a One stem Class 10b Three stems General Any crocus, grape hyacinth or spring flower, other

than those in classes 1 to 10, grown from corm,

rhizome, tuber or bulb and identified.

Class 11a Three stems of any one variety

(one colour)

Class 11b Six stems of two or three varieties

(ie 2 of 3 types or 3 of 2 types)

Shrubs Class 12 Three stems of one or more Spring

flowering shrubs

Primrose or polyanthus Mixed colours allowed

(see definition under 'Rules of the Show' on last page of this Schedule)

Class 13a Six stems of primroses Class 13b Six stems of polyanthus

Heathers Class 14a Three stems of any one variety

Class 14b Six stems of two of three varieties

(ie 2 of 3 types or 3 of 2 types)

Plants grown in a bowl or pot

Class 15a One bowl or pot of bulbs in bloom Class 15b One bowl or pot of **alpine** plant

Class 15c One bowl or pot of other plants in bloom

A collection Class 16 One vase or container (not using oasis)

of assorted spring flowers, including flowering shrubs if

desired.

Miscellaneous Class 17 One vase or container of any single variety

(identified) ty pe of spring flower not otherwise

included in this schedule.

Junior class Exhibitors must be aged under 14; exhibits will be

judged according to the age of the exhibitor Class 18 One mug of spring flowers

RULES OF THE SHOW

- 1. There is no entry fee. Show cards will be provided and must be filled in for each entry.
- 2. Exhibits may be staged from 5.00 to 6.15pm. Judging will start at 6.30pm.
- **3**. There is no limit to the number of entries by an exhibitor in any class but no exhibitor may take more than two awards in any one class.
- 4. Entries will be judged to "Village Show" standards.
- **5**. All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor and have been in his/her possession for *at least three months*.
- **6**. Exhibitors must provide their own containers and support material, eg moss. Up to three leaves of the appropriate foliage may be included for classes 1 to 10, otherwise not restricted.
- 7. Prize certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places as appropriate and will be displayed on the exhibit but no prizes will be awarded.
- **8**. Definitions: Primrose flowers originate from the base of the plant Polyanthus clusters of flowers on a single stem
- **9**. In any dispute concerning the Rules of the Show or Definitions the decision of the Show Secretary shall be final.
- 10. The judges will select their "Best in Show "exhibit and a certificate will be awarded
