Day 1- RHS Garden Bridgewater

We depart 8am from the Angel Corbridge and make our way to Bridgewater RHS where you will have free time to explore this garden

RHS Bridgewater has the newly designed award-winning Weston Walled Garden by Tom Stuart-Smith, amongst the other areas at historic 154 acre Worsley New Hall. These include the emerging Chinese Streamside Garden and Paradise Garden, Kitchen Garden, and Moon Bridge Water viewed from the Welcome Building with cafe and shop.

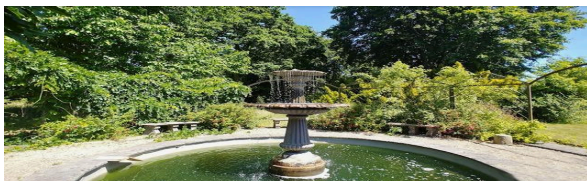


We will then depart and make our way to our Ramada Plaza Wrexham.

Day 2 - Powys Castle NT - an Edwardian formal garden with 17th-century Italianate terraces, considered to be the finest still surviving. The garden also has a Fountain Garden, 18th-century Orangery, 300 year old yew hedges, with views to Long Mountain and the Breidden Hills. Cafe, plant sales and coffee shop.



PM Glansevern - Hand-crafted Ginkgo Gates open the way to the original formal Walled Garden, with flowers, herbs, fruits, and vegetables. Criss-crossing paths lined with flowers and herbs lead to hidden corners of lavender, apple trees, calendula and roses. A Victorian Grotto and Rockery date from around 1840, with a Folly Garden and Wildflower Meadow lead down to the meeting of the River Severn with the River Rhiew. A cascading Water Garden, fed from the Montgomeryshire Canal, with Candelabra Primulas, Hostas and other water loving plants leads to The Lakeside Walk with an Island and Iron Gazebo. Closer to the house, the Formal Gardens offer a scented Wisteria Fountain Walk, traditional long borders, peonies and the original Georgian Orangery. Cafe



Day 3 - Erdigg - A fully restored 18th-century garden, with trained fruit trees, exuberant herbaceous borders, a double avenue of old pleached limes, formal hedges, topiary and a nationally important collection of ivies. The 486-hectare (1,200-acre) landscape pleasure park, designed by William Emes, is a haven of peace and natural beauty, with a 'cup and saucer' cylindrical cascade and the earthworks of a Norman motte-and-bailey castle. PM Dorothy Clive Garden - This 12 acre garden is a beautiful Plantsman's Paradise. A relaxing place packed with plants of interest throughout the year - Laburnum tunnel, alpine scree with pool,

rose walk, edible woodland, seasonal borders, large Mediterranean glasshouse and rhododendron filled woodland with waterfall. The garden is both intimate and informal with a network of meandering paths. Tearoom giftshop.



Day 4 Tatton Park –

Sadly, we head home today with a stop at Tatton Park, arriving home late afternoon.

The 50 acres of landscaped gardens at Tatton Park are the product of almost 300 years of cultivation, using leading landscape architects of the time. One of the most picturesque gardens from Edwardian times. Different areas of the Garden provide their own atmosphere, plant and tree varieties, views and wildlife. Popular features include the walled Kitchen Garden, 100 year old Japanese Garden, and historic glass houses. Cafe.
