### **RULES OF THE SHOW**

- 1. There is no entry fee. Show cards will be provided and must be filled in for each entry.
- 2. Exhibits may be staged from 5.00 to 6.15pm. Judging will start at 6.30pm.
- 3. There is no limit to the number of entries by an exhibitor in any class but no exhibitor may take more than two awards in any one class.
- 4. Entries will be judged to "Village Show" standards.
- 5. All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor and have been in his/her possession for *at least three months*.
- 6. Exhibitors must provide their own containers and support material, eg moss. Up to three leaves of the appropriate foliage may be included for classes 1 to 10, otherwise not restricted.
- 7. Prize certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places as appropriate and will be displayed on the exhibit but no prizes will be awarded.
- 8. Definitions: Primrose flowers originate from the base of the plant Polyanthus clusters of flowers on a single stem
- 9. In any dispute concerning the Rules of the Show or Definitions the decision of the Show Secretary shall be final.

10. The judges will select their "Best in Show "exhibit and a certificate will be awarded
